Publication of a Revision to the Regional Spatial Strategy for the East of England

The Secretary of State published a Revision to the East of England Plan (a Revision to the East of England Regional Spatial Strategy) concerning accommodation for Gypsies and Travellers and Travelling Showpeople, on Monday 20 July 2009. In addition, the Secretary of State published a Supporting Document, which includes a summary of consultation responses, a schedule of changes and reasons and a Sustainability Statement. This final, single issue revision to the East of England Plan reflects consideration of responses to the consultation on the Secretary of State's Proposed Changes, which were made in the light of the recommendations of the independent Panel who conducted an Examination in Public into the Draft Policy.

The policies were subject to assessment under the Habitats Regulations. The Sustainability Statement concludes that the policies are in accordance with the principles of sustainable development and that they do not give rise to adverse environmental impacts.

In accordance with section 113(3) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004, any person aggrieved by the relevant document may make an application to the High Court no later than the end of a period of six weeks starting on 20 July 2009 on the grounds that:

- a) the document is not within the relevant power granted by Part 1 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004; or
- b) a procedural requirement has not been complied with.
